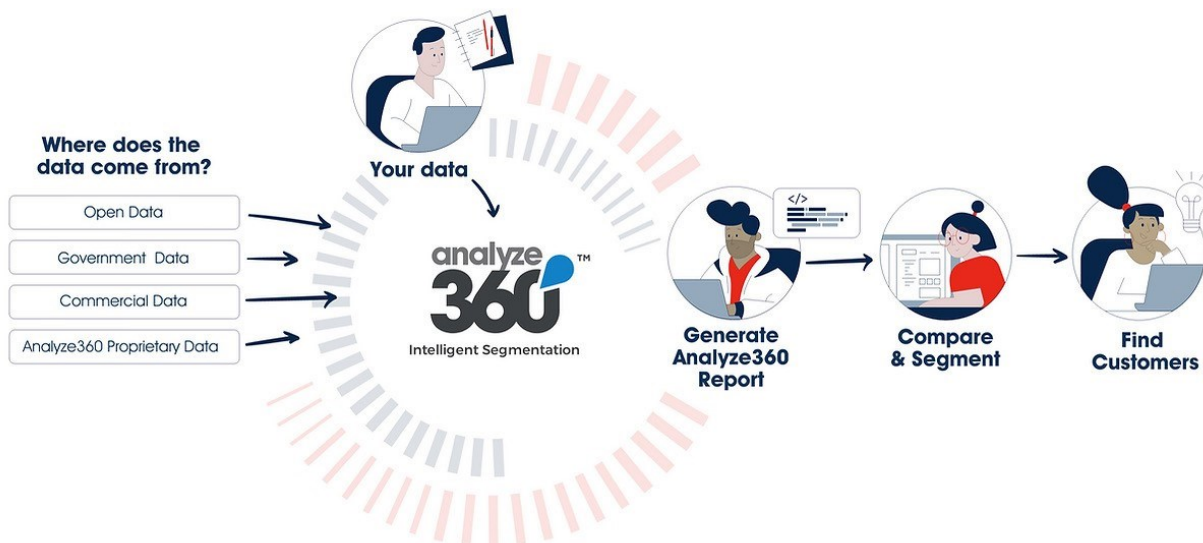

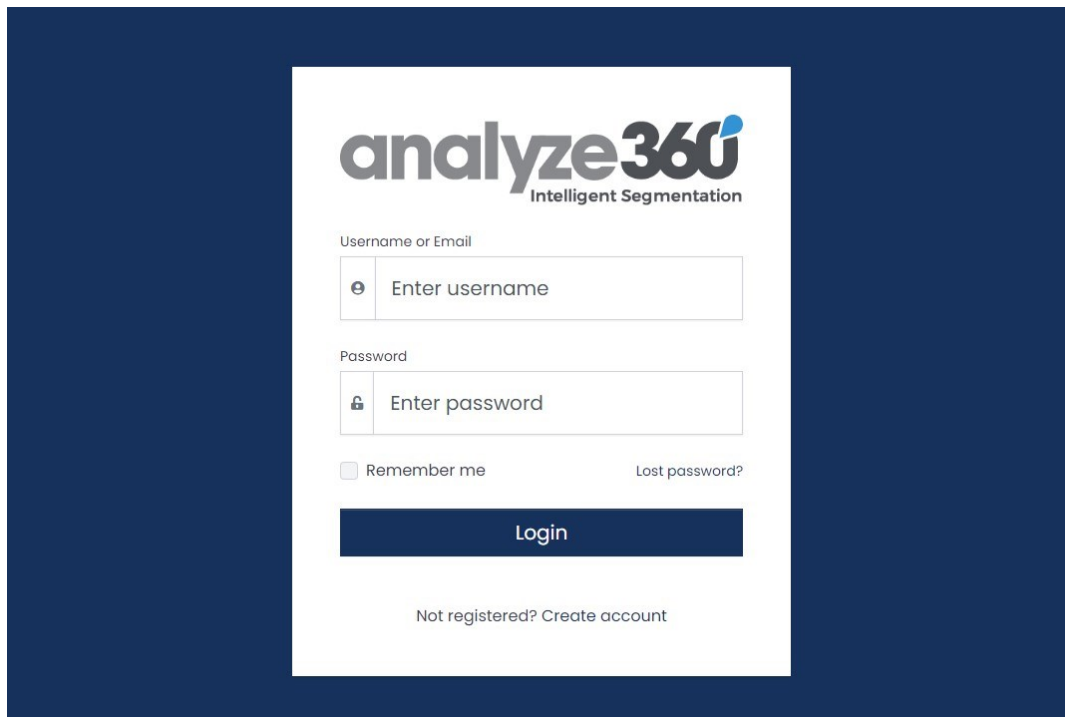

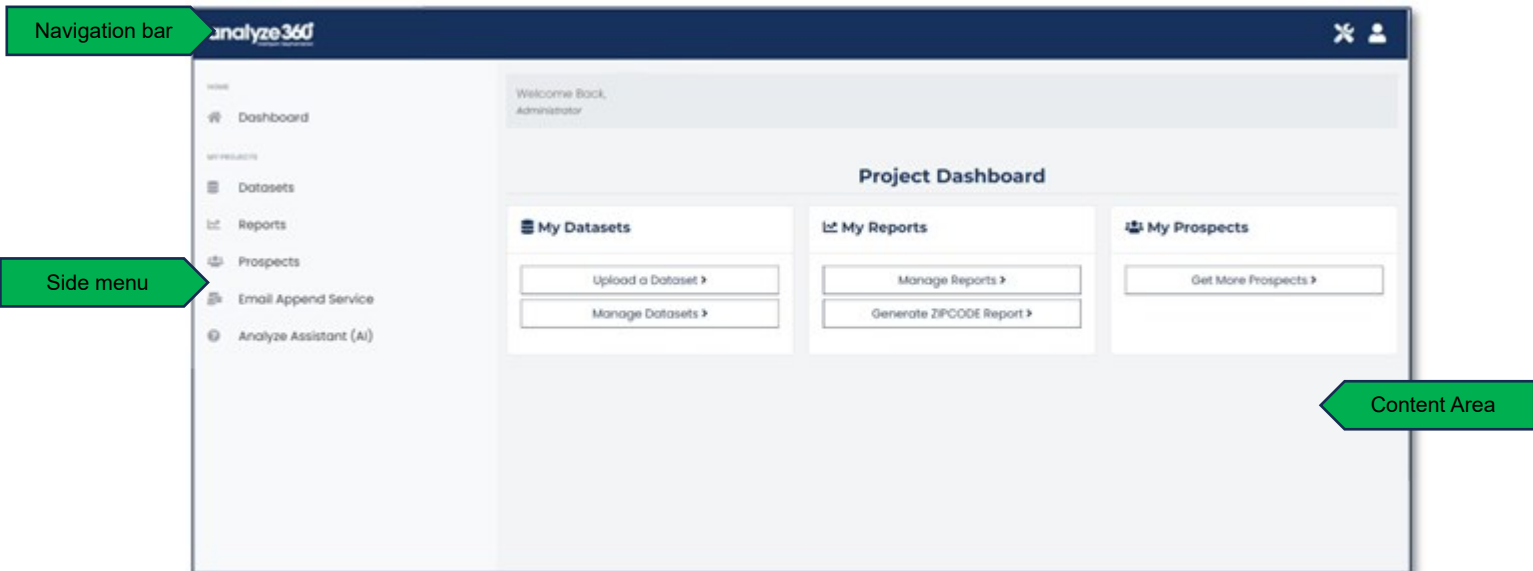

Navigating the Platform

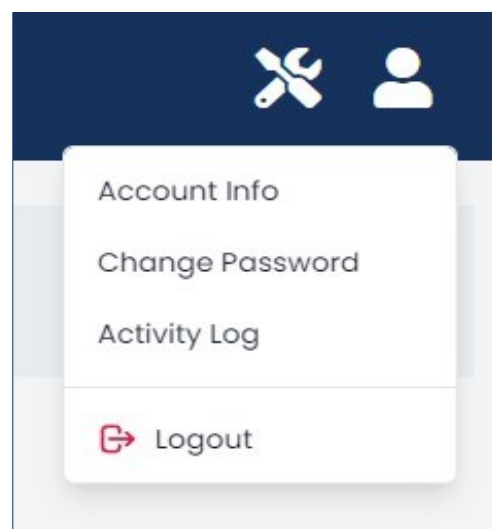

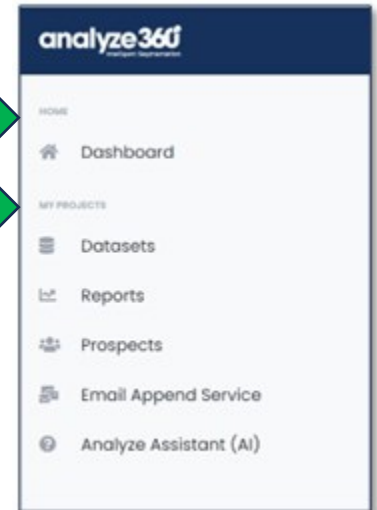

- **Consistency:** Maintain consistency in data entry. For instance, adhere to a standard format for names, addresses, and other required fields, and stick to it throughout your dataset.

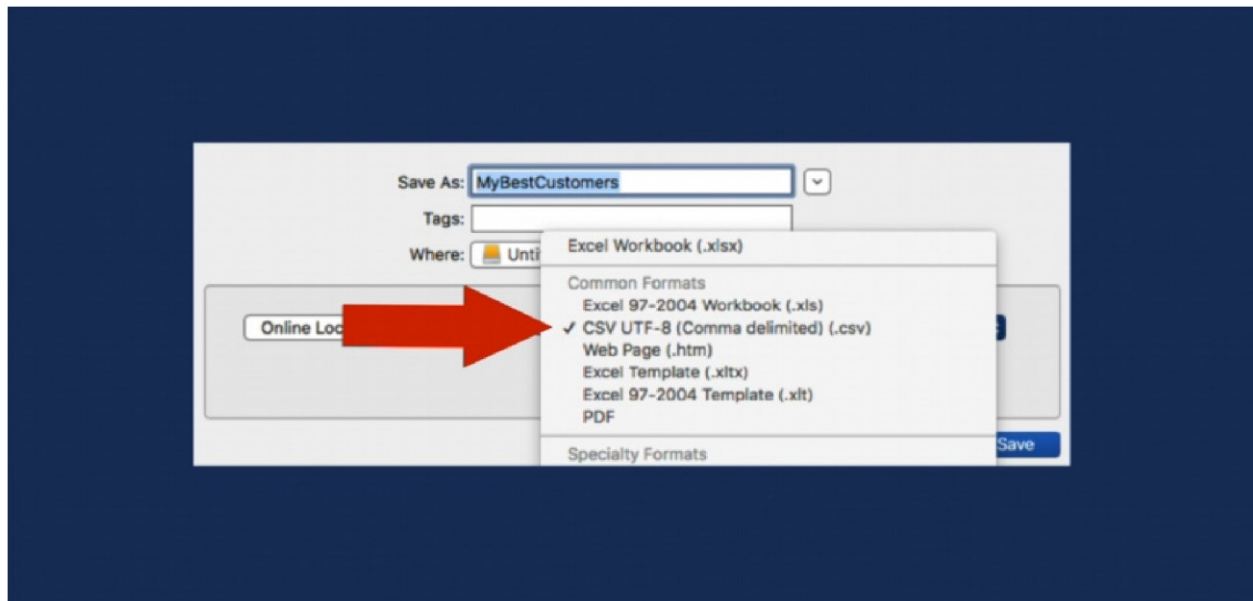

- **Header Row:** The first row should contain the column headers, which correspond to the different data fields—First Name, Last Name, Street Address, City, State, and Zip Code.
- **Data Rows:** Each subsequent row represents a single record, with the different fields separated by commas.





- **Save as CSV:** Once your data is organized, save the file in the CSV format. In Excel or Google Sheets, you can do this by choosing 'Save As' and selecting CSV from the list of file types.

CSV Common Mistakes to Avoid:

- Use personal names instead of business names.
- Do not include sensitive information like Social Security Numbers, usernames, or passwords.

Step-by-Step Guide to Data Upload

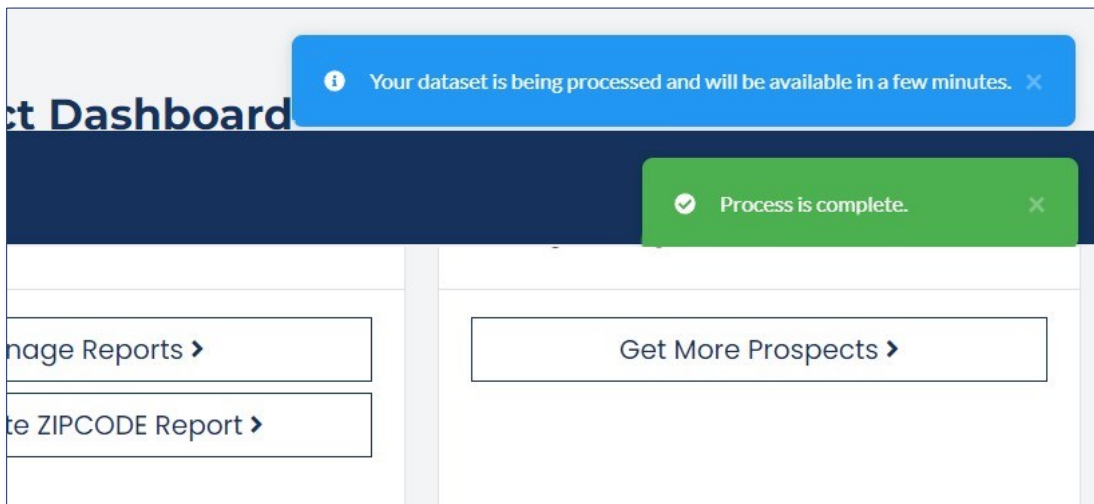
To upload a dataset, go to the dashboard and select **Upload a Dataset**. Ensure that your upload is in CSV format. **Please note:** other formats like XLS, XLSX, and ODS are not supported.

Choose the option to "**Build summary and full sociometrics reports for this dataset**," select your file, and then select the **Upload** button.

Original Upload

Select the filename to access your dataset in the default mode called "Original Upload." Key features in this view include:



- **Tabs:** Navigate between "Original Upload," "Propensity Model," and "Appended Consumer Data" to access different data views or analytical models.
- **Data Table:** View customer details such as names, phone numbers, emails, and addresses, organized in a tabular format.
- **Adjustable View:** Customize the number of visible entries per page via dropdown menu.
- **Search Functionality:** Utilize the search bar to quickly locate specific entries within the database.
- **Export Option:** Download the displayed data in a CSV file format for external use or analysis.

Propensity Model

The "Propensity Model" tab displays a predictive model that scores individuals on how closely their data correlates to the average or typical values within the dataset. The scores may be interpreted as follows:

- **OVERALL_SCORE:** This represents an aggregate measure of correlation across multiple factors, showing how closely an individual aligns with the average profile derived from the entire dataset.
- **DEM_SCORE (Demographic Score):** Reflects how closely an individual's demographic details (age, family composition, income, net worth, etc.) match the average demographic profile.
- **PSYCH_SCORE (Psychographic Score):** Indicates the degree to which an individual's psychographic characteristics, such as lifestyle or personality traits, align with the average psychographic profile in the dataset.

Such scores are often used to segment the target population and to identify individuals who are most representative of, or deviate from, the typical case. This can help in customizing marketing efforts, tailoring services, or addressing specific needs of segments that are over or under the average.

Appended Consumer Data

The "Appended Consumer Data" tab displays your initial dataset enriched with extensive consumer insights across hundreds of variables sourced from a database of over 220 million individuals in the 

US. It encompasses demographic, psychographic, and geodemographic data, along with consumer preferences, all presented in their unprocessed state.

How to Use:

1. **Access and Review:** After uploading your data, select the **"Appended Consumer Data"** tab to see your dataset enhanced with additional consumer information. This expanded view allows you to review the newly appended details for each entry.
2. **Export Data:** Use the **"Download.csv"** button to export the enriched dataset. This file is ready for external analysis or further processing in other systems.
3. **Proceed to Reporting:** Navigate to the reporting section for in-depth analysis, where you can generate insights through visualizations and other reporting tools.

Generating ZIPCODE Reports

To access different reports, navigate to **"Reports"** in the side menu or choose **"Manage Reports"** on the Project Dashboard to see current reports.

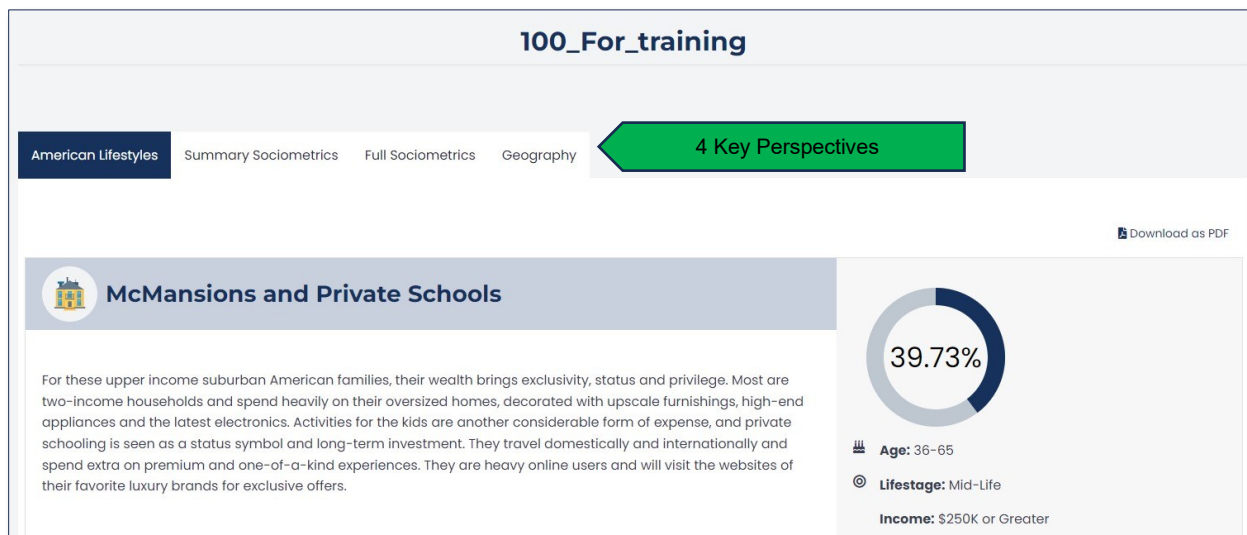
ZIPCODE report is a collection of lifestyle, summary sociometric, and full sociometric reports for a whole US zip code. You can generate a ZIPCODE report by clicking **"Generate ZIPCODE Report."**




Viewing Reports

Once your data has been processed, you can access your report by going to “**Manage My Reports**” and selecting the relevant one. The report generated by Analyze360® provides four key perspectives on your data:

- American Lifestyles:** This section groups US households into 32 categories based on factors like age, income, and household composition. Consumers grouped into a single lifestyle category tend to have similar interests and buying behavior. Lifestyle categories help identify specific segments within your audience, such as active grandparents, high net-worth seniors, or young families.
- Summary Sociometrics:** Here, you get a comprehensive overview of your audience compared to all US households. It covers aspects like household income, net worth, credit rating, gender distribution, age demographics, ethnicity, number of children, marital status, home ownership, education, and home market value.
- Full Sociometrics:** This section compares variables distinctive to your target audience with the Baseline. For example, if your customer list primarily consists of donors to a religious charity, religious books and items might be the most distinctive sociometric variable. It includes about 200 variables, offering detailed insights into your audience. Variables are ranked from most differentiated (your dataset vs. the baseline) to least differentiated.
- Geography:** The final section of the report allows you to visualize your audience on a map. Each plot represents an individual or cluster in the target audience, providing valuable insights into their geographical distribution.



Cluster Explorer

The "Cluster Explorer" feature provides an intuitive way to analyze American Lifestyle clusters within the Analyze360® platform. It allows users to explore 32 unique sociometric clusters with detailed 

descriptions across 17 aspects, enabling precise consumer segmentation and behavioral insights. This tool enhances your ability to tailor marketing strategies to specific audience groups.

How to Use the Cluster Explorer:

- Navigate to "Explore American Lifestyles" in the side menu and select "Cluster Explorer."
- Use the dropdown menu to select from 32 sociometric clusters, such as "Big City Benefactors," "Young Achievers," or "Living the Dream."

Once a cluster is selected, you will see detailed descriptions across 17 lifestyle aspects, including:

Get Prospects

Option 1: Create New Prospect List

In the Project Dashboard, select on "**Get More Prospects**" or select "**Prospects**" in the side menu to generate a list of potential customers ("prospects") based on certain criteria.

- 1. Enter a Prospect File Name:** Enter a name for the file that will be created and saved as a ".csv" file, a format compatible with spreadsheet programs.
- 2. Select statistical model:** Choose a statistical model to define the criteria for prospect selection. The standard choice is "All US Households (use if unsure)," a broad and general model. Alternatively, the "Use a previous dataset (advanced)" option allows you to generate a prospect list that conforms to the demographic and psychographic models associated with a previously-uploaded dataset.
- 3. Specify Quantity:** Specify the number of prospects you wish to generate.
- 4. Choose Demographic Variables:** Narrow down their search using demographic filters like Gender, Age, Ethnicity, Income, Net Worth, and Credit Score. For each category, there is a dropdown menu presenting predefined ranges or options for selection.
- 5. Additional Data:** Use the "Add Geographic Data" and "Add Prospect Data" buttons to further refine the prospect list with geographical information or sociometric and lifestyle variables.

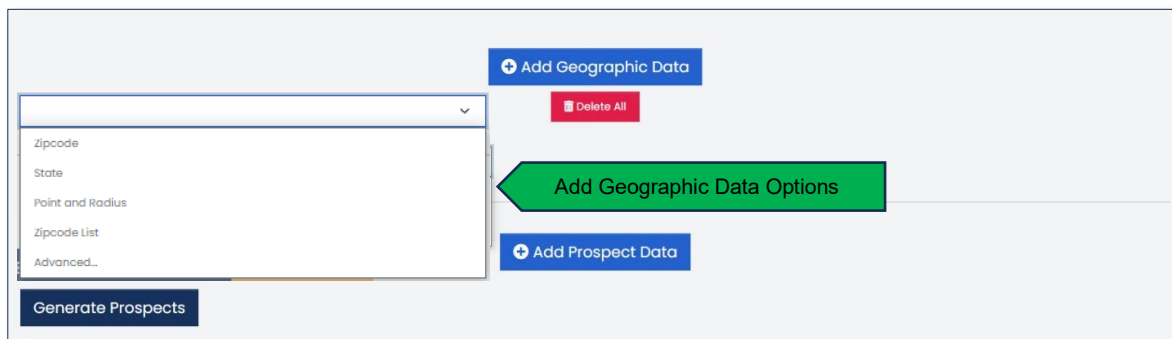

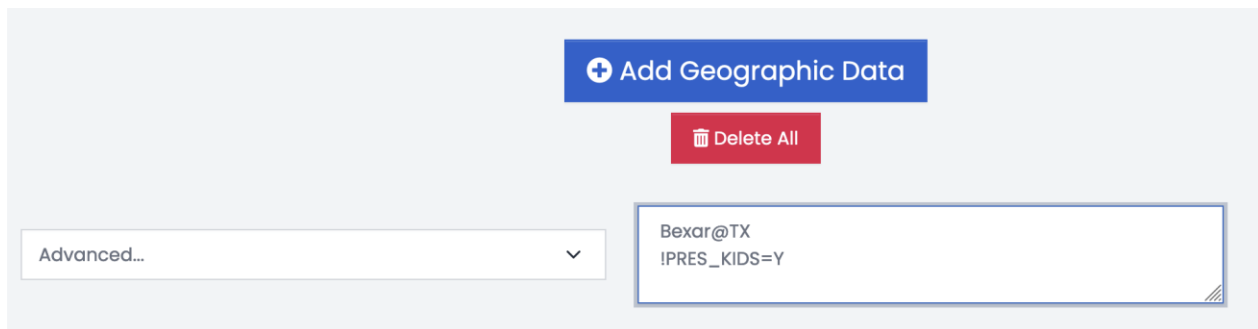
Add Geographic Data options include:

- **Zipcode:** Enter a single zipcode to target prospects in that specific area.
- **State:** Select a state from the dropdown menu to target prospects residing within that state.
- **Point and Radius:** Enter a latitude and longitude followed by a distance in miles (lat;lon;d). This will create a circular target area with the specified radius around the point provided. For example, “34.0522; -118.2437; 10” defines a 10-mile radius around a point in Los Angeles.
- **Zipcode List:** Input a list of zipcodes separated by commas to include multiple distinct areas in the search.

All codes are entered into the ‘Advanced’ box under ‘Add Geographic Data’:



Point and Radius

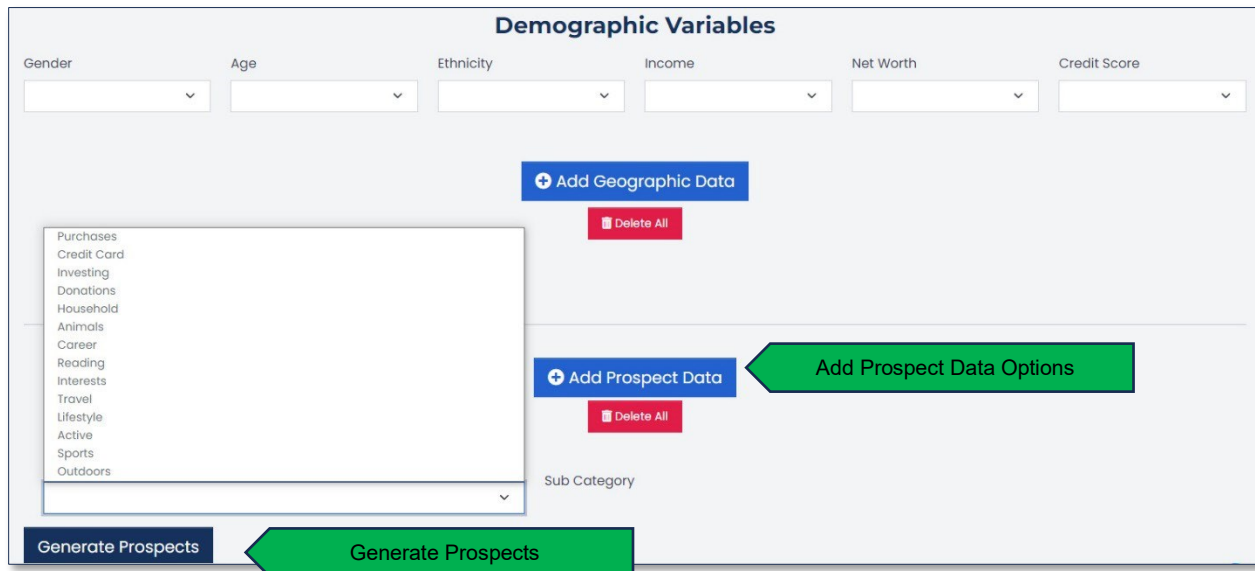

Add Prospect Data to add more criteria that reflect the prospects' behavioral and psychographic characteristics. This can include but is not limited to:

- **Purchases:** Type of products the prospect tends to buy.
- **Credit Card:** Prospects who are likely to own or use credit cards.
- **Investing:** Individuals interested in investment opportunities.
- **Donations:** Those who have a history of donating to causes.
- **Household:** Prospects based on household size or type.

- **Animals:** Pet owners or those interested in animal-related products or services.
- **Career:** Prospects based on their professional background or industry.
- **Reading, Interests, Travel, Lifestyle, Active, Sports, Outdoors:** Prospects who have shown interest in these areas based on past purchasing data or surveys.

These additional data points allow for a highly targeted approach to prospect selection, enabling businesses to tailor their marketing strategies to specific interests and behaviors, significantly increasing the chances of conversion.



Select the Generate Prospects once all desired criteria have been selected and any additional demographic or geographic data have been added. This action will process the input data against the statistical model and produce a .csv file containing a list of prospects that match the defined parameters. The generated file can be used in various CRM systems or for direct marketing efforts.

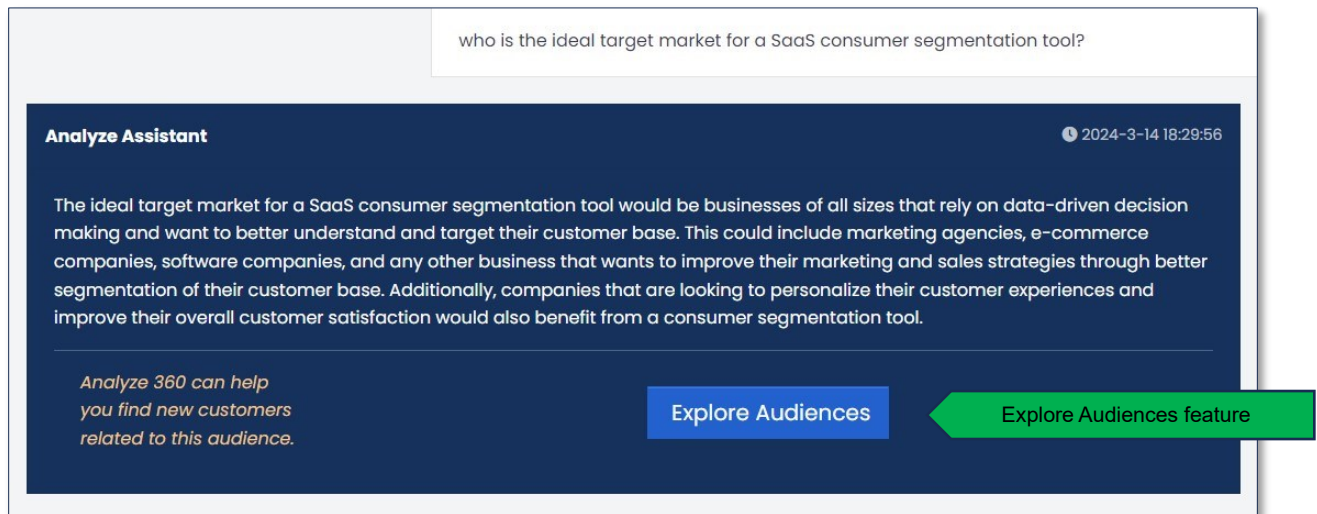

The Email Append Lookup service is designed to enhance your customer database by adding missing email addresses. This tool uses credits for appending emails, which are deducted per lookup request.

Please note that each lookup request consumes email append credits from your account. The service notifies you of the remaining credits and provides a link to purchase more if needed. You will not be able to perform email appends until you purchase credits.



How to Use:

1. Select a data set by choosing **“Select Existing Dataset”** if you want to work with a dataset previously uploaded to the system or use **“Upload New File”** to add a new dataset for the email append process.
2. **If selecting an existing dataset**, use the “Select Existing Dataset” dropdown to choose the one you wish to append emails to, then define the increment in which the tool will search for email addresses (typically in batches of 100).
3. **Next Select “Generate Appended Email List”** to start the appending process. The application will match and append email lists based on the filename and selected range.
4. Once the process is complete, you can access the updated files in the **“Completed Email Appended Files”** section.
